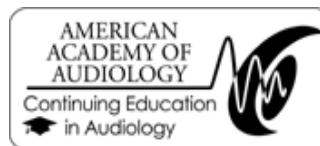

KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

Todd A. Ricketts, Ph.D.

Todd A. Ricketts, Ph.D., CCC-A, is a Professor and the Director of Graduate Studies at the Vanderbilt Bill Wilkerson Center, and the Director of the Dan Maddox Hearing Aid Research Laboratory. He has published more than 100 articles and book chapters and provided over 300 presentations both nationally and internationally. He continues to pursue a very active federally and industry funded research program studying various aspects of hearing, hearing aids and cochlear implants. He was named a Fellow of the American Speech Language and Hearing Association in 2006 and received an editor's award from the American Journal of Audiology in 2008. He is a past editor-in-chief of the quarterly journal Trends in Amplification and the past chair of the Vanderbilt Institutional Review Board. He is a current associate editor for the Journal of Speech, Language and Hearing Research and currently serves on the board of directors of the American Academy of Audiology.

Anu Sharma, Ph.D.

Dr. Anu Sharma is Professor in the Department of Speech Language and Hearing, Institute for Cognitive Science, and Center for Neuroscience at the University of Colorado at Boulder. Her research is focused on examining brain plasticity in children and adults with hearing loss. Dr. Sharma has given several keynote addresses, including at the American Academy of Audiology, British Academy of Audiology and British Society of Audiology, among other venues. Her research is funded by the U.S. National Institutes of Health.
