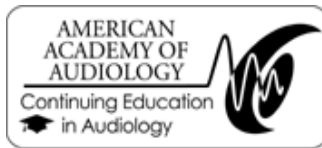

## KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

### **Dennis D. Van Vliet, Au.D.**

Dennis Van Vliet is an audiologist and business professional with more than 40 years of experience in the clinical field and business of Audiology. Dr. Van Vliet has a Bachelor of Science degree from UC Irvine; a Master of Arts degree from Cal-State University, Fullerton; and a Doctor of Audiology degree from Central Michigan University. He has worked as an audiologist in medical, educational and private practice settings for more than 40 years. Professional activities have included formation of the Independent Hearing Aid Fitting Forum, a volunteer study group that developed a comprehensive hearing aid fitting protocol for nonlinear hearing aids, and leadership positions with state and national professional organizations. He has been invited as a speaker in the Americas, Europe, Australia, New Zealand and Africa to present information on a variety of hearing aid technology topics and other professional issues. His opinions are expressed monthly in the "Final Word" feature of the [Hearing Review](#).

### **Alison Grimes, Au.D.**

Alison Grimes, AuD, is Director of Audiology at UCLA Health, Director of the UCLA Newborn Hearing Screening Program, and an Assistant Clinical Professor in Head and Neck Surgery at the David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA. She is also a Past-President of the American Academy of Audiology. As one of the representatives to the Joint Committee on Infant Hearing since 2006, Alison participated in the writing of the 2007 Position Statement, the 2012 Early Intervention document, and the 2016 Position Statement (in development). Alison also co-chaired the Pediatric Amplification Task Force for the American Academy of Audiology, and was a member of the 2012 AAA Pediatric Diagnostic Guidelines Task Force. Alison is Chair of the Audiology Licensing Board in California (Department of Consumer Affairs), and has served on the board for 16 years. She actively sees patients at UCLA, including newborn/infant diagnostics, as well as pediatric and adult hearing aid patients.
